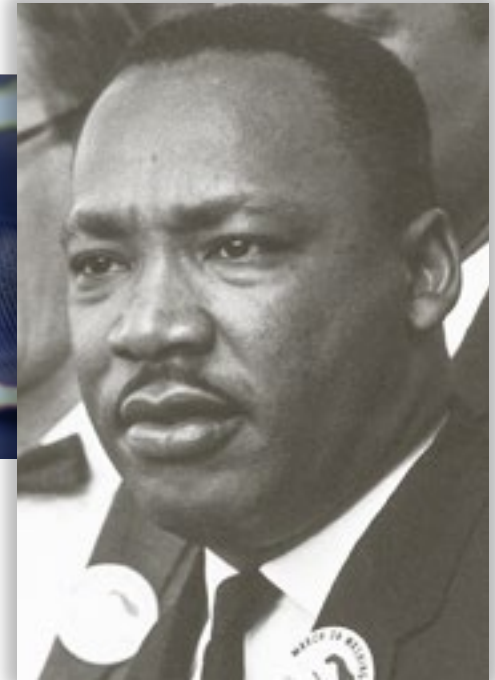


In Memoriam
MARTIN LUTHER KING JR.



This year marks the 50th anniversary of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s assassination. In his last speech *I've Been to the Mountaintop*, Dr. King delivered a powerful message to a packed congregation at Mason Temple Church of God in Christ in Memphis, Tenn., on April 3, 1968. Some of his last words in that speech seemed to foreshadow his untimely death that came less than 24 hours later. Dr. King left behind a legacy of hope, equity and unity for all Americans that has had a profound impact on the nation for more than half a century.

“I’ve seen the promised land. I may not get there with you. But I want you to know tonight, that we, as a people, will get to the promised land.”
